The subject of the Summer School will be on natural catastrophes, extreme events (such as climate change and floods) as well as their consequences for infrastructures, settlements among others. The main points of interest are going to be

- (1)** the identification of natural risks and their consequences for urban development as well as the challenges that emerge from the handling of extreme weather conditions and other hazards,
- (2)** the analysis of the course of action in spatial planning esp. with regard to the understanding of (local) uncertainties (resilience as a planning goal) to additionally
- (3)** define coherent integrated action strategies and measures for the sustainable and resilient planning of urban areas.

Renowned researchers from different European countries will support the Summer School as tutors and guest lecturers. All students are asked to prepare for the Summer School in advance following the requirements of the tutors and will be informed in due course.

Successful applicants will receive detailed information on requirements after March 15 th. Upon the finalisation of the Summer School, all students will receive a confirmation letter of participation.

The results of the Summer School including presentations and sketches among others will be presented on the project website.

Who we are looking for:

We are looking for **10 interested Master students** (Umweltplanung, Landschaftsarchitektur, Architektur, European Master in Territorial Development, Geographie, etc) to join the Summer School. Together with 12 Master students from the NTUA, you will have the chance to gather new methodological knowledge and experience, build first international networks and, gain practical language skills (professional English).
